The screens of www.teaching-design.com appear in the form of gif and jpeg images contained in an html “envelope”. This procedure enables you to design them and to control very precisely the typography and image positioning... at the same time as ensuring that they appear identical on all machines.

We have used the most widespread programs and therefore suggest you design your screens in Illustrator, convert them into gif or jpeg images in ImageReady and incorporate these images into html code via Dreamweaver. Other compatible programs may also be used. For animation, you can either use animated gif or Flash (the suggested Illustrator files can be read by this program).

To do this, and for the sake of the consistency – particularly technical consistency — of www.teaching-design.com, please download (in the form of archives for Macintosh or Pc) and use the various templates available on line: an Illustrator file; an ImageReady template comprising cuts of the “slices”; an html file and its images in which the rollover of the browser palette and the links to the different parts of the site are active, except for the links to “previous screen” and “next screen”, indicated by grey circles on either side of the browser palette.
